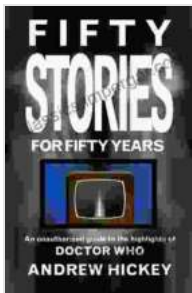


Fifty Stories for Fifty Years: Celebrating the Golden Anniversary of the National Endowment for the Arts

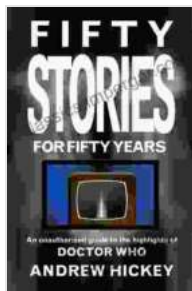

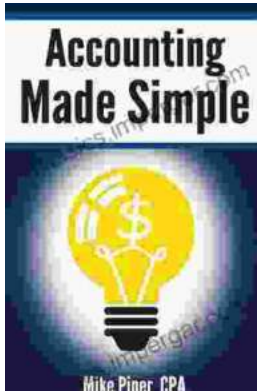
